Food Delivery Platforms SB 676* HB 1099	Sen. Bradley (R) Rep. Melo (R)	Requires increased transparency to consumers. Requires consent to list a restaurant on a food delivery platform. Establishes a mechanism for increased communication between consumers and restaurants.	Support	
Employment Restrictions for 16- and 17-year-olds SB 1596 HB 49*	Sen. Burgess (R) Rep. Chaney (R)	Removes certain employment restrictions for minors 16 & 17 years of age.	Support	
VISIT FLORIDA	General Appropriations Package	Visit Florida will be funded in the amount of \$80 Million.	Support	
Combatting Human Trafficking SB 796 HB 7063*	Sen. Avila (R) House Judiciary Committee	Changes the signs Florida hoteliers are required to hang in their businesses to reflect that calls to report suspected human trafficking should be directed to the Florida Hotline instead of the National Hotline.	Neutral
